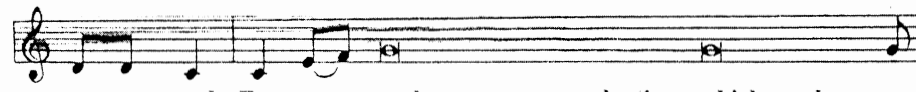

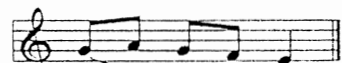

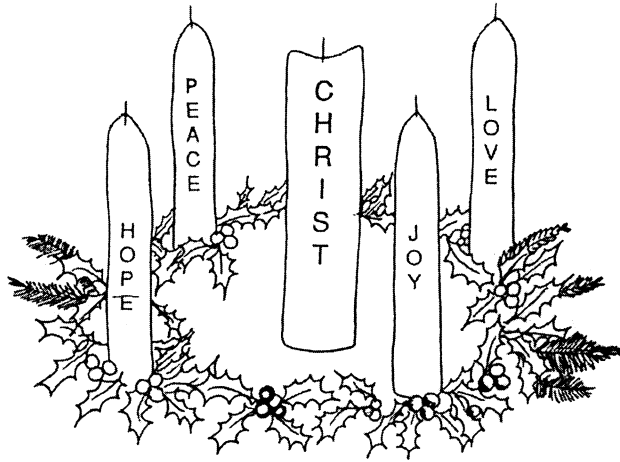
WELS NEWS
