Northside Lutheran Ministries needs your prayers and support

Northside Lutheran Ministries on 26th Street and North Avenue in Milwaukee has been blessed by God since its beginning when Seminary students conducted Bible classes at the North Avenue Smoke Shop in the 1990s. Deacon Tom Hall and Deaconess Leila Watson have continued to serve people with food and clothing and also with Bible study and spiritual support. Local people have come to see Northside Lutheran Ministries as an important part of their lives. They have found comfort, hope, and peace in their relationship with God through Bible study and worship.

But the last several years have been difficult for Northside Lutheran Ministries. With the dissolution of the Greater Milwaukee Area Chapter of WELS Kingdom Workers and a misleading letter that stated that Northside Lutheran Ministries would be closing, support for NLM has gone down dramatically. Though several people and local churches still support NLM and help pay utilities we are unable to give any support to the Deacon or Deaconess for all the work they do. The building is also in dire need of maintenance and repair. Beside that, a recent break-in and damage to the interior of the building as well as the theft of some major appliances like a computer, a TV wall screen, some of the security cameras and our internet appliances, have created a feeling of concern. To their credit, the people of NLM have said they will not let this discourage them or defeat them. They will continue to learn about God's love and be at the center.

We are asking for your prayers and, where possible, your support. We are asking God to turn this time of concern and fear into an opportunity for NLM to become something that serves as a blessing to the people of the community and that NLM can move on to bigger things in the community.

We are also asking for someone to consider becoming personally involved at Northside Lutheran Ministries.

1. We currently have two board members. Our president is Pastor Aaron Robinson. The remaining board member is a retired pastor. We could use a couple more board members to assist in making decisions and supporting the monthly meeting when one of the present members is unable to attend for some reason. Also some other points of view could be appreciated
2. We could also use the help of someone who could accomplish some of the administrative duties, such as keeping donations records, sending out thank you letters and quarterly appeal letters, etc. That person would also be welcomed to attend board meetings.
3. We have received donations of food and clothing from many people and organizations in the past. But this has declined with some of the events of the past. More donations would be appreciated.

We would also like to thank Mr. Ken Lemke and Mrs. Carol Bradtke who have helped out at the center over the past year.
