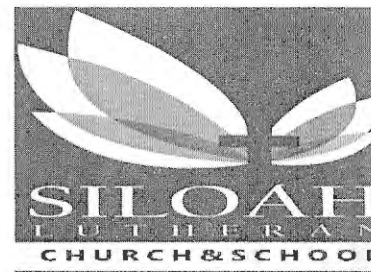

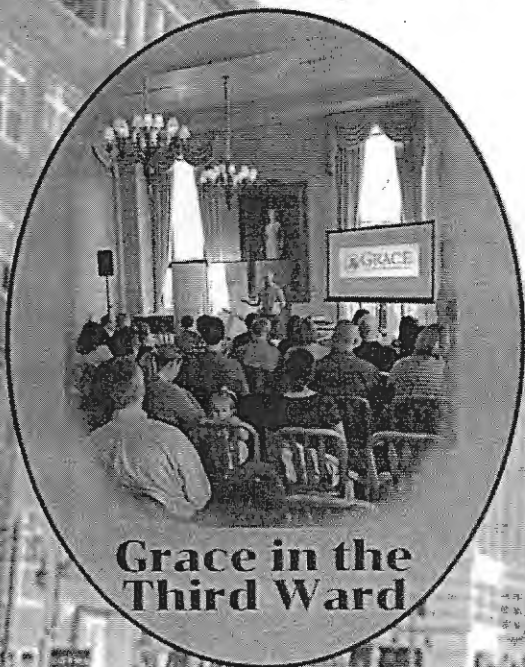

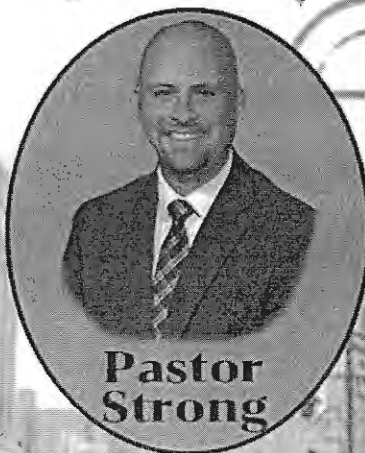

Greetings from the Hahn Financial Group, Inc., and the WELS 403b Shepherd Plan!

Hahn Financial Group (HFG) serves as the Plan Advisor for the WELS 403b Shepherd Plan. Following the decision made by the WELS 2021 Synod Convention, the WELS Pension Plan will be frozen on December 31, 2021. Beginning January 1, 2022, eligible workers will receive contributions to their own individual accounts in the WELS Shepherd Plan, the WELS denominational defined contribution plan, to be used for these retirement benefits.

As we prepare for this new process, the first step is for your organization to adopt the plan. HFG will be working together with Retirement Plan Consultants (RPC), the Third-Party Administrator and Recordkeeper, to provide your organization with the required adoption paperwork. More details on this process will be forthcoming. Once the organization has adopted the plan and is set up, then we will follow-up with participant enrollment information. This information will be sent to your designated plan administrator, for all eligible employees to complete.

Important: We are asking for your assistance in providing us the name(s), email address(es) and phone number(s) of the individual(s) who will be designated/authorized to process/sign this adoption paperwork and process future payroll contributions and deferrals. This information will allow RPC to send the required adoption paperwork directly to this individual(s) for completion via DocuSign and automatic return to RPC. Please provide us with the following information, at your earliest convenience, but no later than Sept. 24, 2021, as we have an end of September 2021 goal for sending out the DocuSign email. It is highly recommended that you have separate individuals assigned as the Plan Administrator (authorized signer for the church) and Payroll Contact (submits deferrals, receives contribution change notifications). Please call us with the following information. If you prefer to email us this information, please request a SECURE EMAIL that we can send to you to ensure information comes to us encrypted. You can reply to this email and simply state you desire a SECURE EMAIL.
