

316NOW's name is a mash-up of John 3:16 and a giant exclamation point (NOW). We are determined to share God's good news about forgiveness in Jesus across China NOW.

The capacity for Western Christians to share God's grace in China is rapidly diminishing, however. Read more here.

Nonetheless, 316NOW is committed to pursuing the avenues that the Holy Spirit opens to us. Here's our approach.

- As long as we have access to online classrooms in China, our Bible institute will continue to teach Chinese church leaders sound theology, deep-dive Bible study, and caring pastoral practice. We are teaching 200 students each week and plan for a 10% higher enrollment in 2020. We are expanding our curriculum and improving our courses. Read more here.
- We have launched a new program, *Sheep to Lambs*, that equips Chinese Christians to teach children about God's grace in Jesus. This is important in China because it's illegal to teach anyone under 18 about the Bible. Sunday schools no longer exist there; most Christian camps and schools have been closed. *Sheep to Lambs* provides training and lesson materials so any teacher can be successful. It also provides age-appropriate and Biblically sound materials for students. Read more here.
- We are investigating how a family ministry orogram might help us help Chinese leaders strengthen families and marriages. Families are in distress in China. The empowering of God's grace can change that.
- We pledge to stay alert to and to investigate other opportunities the Lord gives us so that many more of China's 1.4 billion souls come to trust Jesus as their Savior. If you have suggestions, email us at 316NOW@316NOW.org or tap here.

Expanding outreach in Africa

• As our sister synods in Africa are maturing and growing more independent, they are reaching into new areas to quench the thirst of those seeking the Water of Life. One of these new missions is the newly registered Obadiah Lutheran Synod–Uganda.

The request for help came from a man named Makisimu Musa, a pastor leading a fledgling church body in Uganda. He caught wind of a Lutheran church body in America called WELS as well as synods in Zambia and Malawi called the Lutheran Church of Central Africa (LCCA). He heard about their sound doctrine and practice and wanted to know more.

So, Missionary John Hartmann, the One Africa Team outreach coordinator, assembled a team and planned an initial trip. On Dec. 1, 2018, Hartmann, Rev. Pembeleka (LCCA-Malawi), and Missionary John Holtz went to Uganda to meet Musa. The success of this first meeting led to a second trip to Uganda in June 2019. Like the first meeting in December 2018, this trip served several purposes: visiting congregations, meeting the pastors and evangelists, building relationships, and teaching God's Word.

Holtz says, "Visiting the congregations allows us to see how extensive this Lutheran synod is and to observe what's 'on the ground.' Attending worship services, listening to sermons, and talking with the leaders give us opportunities to evaluate messages and doctrines being preached; this, in turn, helps inform our teaching approach and coursework. We aim to design and teach the classes that can have the most impact as we move toward declaration of fellowship."

But why the name "Obadiah Lutheran Synod"? Our fellow Christians in Uganda had initially chosen "New Hope" as the name for their synod but soon learned from the Ugandan government that this name was already in use. As Musa explains: "(We) chose the name Obadiah because we're a small growing group of worshipers of the Lord, and Obadiah means 'worshipers of the Lord.' Obadiah is a minor prophet; it's the shortest book. When you look at our synod, it is also minor. We are (still small) and at a growing stage."

Currently, Obadiah Lutheran Synod serves ... more than 700 members in 11 congregations.
