DID YOU KNOW?

February 2002-August 2004- The Church Council gave permission to the Pilgrim group to upgrade and modernize the ladies' bathroom in Hoffmann Hall. This included 3 new commodes, a new ceramic floor, new fixtures, some electrical work and painting that was completed.

May 2003 - The Pilgrims redesigned the downstairs bedroom and bathroom in the parsonage for pastoral use. Wallpaper was removed and replaced by fresh paint. Office furniture was purchased which included a desk and parson chairs.

April 2006- The Pilgrims organization bought folding chairs for church and gym use. The Engineering staff found it helpful because they were easier to transport between buildings.

October 2008-September 2009 - A total of 18 round tables were purchased with storage racks for use in Hoffmann Hall. The tables are used for Easter breakfast dining, repasts, and other special events.

Over the years the women of this group have displayed their passion for Christian service and being good stewards, by interacting with the pastors regarding needs of the church. Cleveland State University Eckles Inks Professional Contract In Ireland

CLEVELAND, Ohio – After a successful collegiate career at Cleveland State, former Viking Lex Eckles has been signed to play professionally for Glanmire BC in Cork, Ireland. Eckles is the second Viking to ink a professional contract over the last three years, and the fourth to do so over the last seven years. "Basketball has been part of my life ever since I was a little kid, and there is still a lot of basketball left in me," Eckles said. "I'm glad to get the opportunity to continue my basketball career, and I will be forever thankful to Coach P and Cleveland State for what they have provided me over the last four years."

Eckles, who will join Glanmire BC in mid September, leaves Cleveland State after graduating this summer with a degree in communication along with minors in art and marketing. Throughout her career, Eckles was one of Cleveland State's most consistent shooters, finishing her career with a .496 field goal percentage (150-for-320). Included in this was a .498 clip during the 2014-15 season, which led the Vikings and was tops in the Horizon League.

During the same season, Eckles also ranked second in the Horizon League with 49 blocked shots – a mark that ranks seventh on the CSU single-season record list.

Eckles played in 57 games during her time at Cleveland State after battling injuries throughout her last two seasons, and averaged 6.5 points, 5.8 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game.


