SILOAH'S BELIEFS ON THE LORD'S SUPPER

The Lord's Supper is:

- a gift which Christ our Lord has given to His Church.
- a tangible form of the Gospel that forgives us our sins.
- a Sacrament that expresses the full extent of Christ's love for His Church.
- an expression of unity and oneness in faith and doctrine.

The Lord's Supper is not:

- open to anyone and everyone.
- open to unbelievers or those who reject Jesus as the eternal Son of God.
- open to those who disagree with the doctrine and teachings of Siloah and the Wisconsin Synod.
- open to anyone who holds membership in a church that is not in fellowship with Siloah.

Scripture plainly says:

"The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? For we, though many, are one bread and one body. For we all partake of that one bread."

-1 Corinthians 10:16,17

There must be unity and agreement before a participation in the body and blood of Christ.

"Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of The Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of The Lord. But let a person examine her/himself, and so let her/him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For whoever eats and drinks in an unworthy manner, eats and drinks judgment to her/himself, not discerning The Lord's body."

-1 Corinthians 11:27-29

The Lord's Supper is intended to bless us, but if received "in an unworthy manner," it may harm us.

Out of love and respect for our Lord Jesus, instruction is given before we receive the Sacrament. All Siloah Partners have been instructed in The Lord's Supper and hold to the beliefs printed above. If you are not a member of Siloah, neither a member of a Wisconsin Synod church nor a member of a congregation in fellowship with WELS, we gently ask that you **refrain** from receiving the Sacrament of The Lord's Supper.

Remember the reception of The Lord's Supper does not make us Christians, nor does not receiving the Sacrament make us unbelievers. There will be people in Heaven from all different Christian church-denominations. For Jesus tells us in Mark 16:16, "Whoever believes and is baptized shall be saved." In Heaven there will be no need for church-denominations, for everyone will be united in love and understanding of God's good and perfect will.

However, here, in this fallen world, plagued with sin, corruption and misunderstanding, there are church-denominations. Wherever a person pledges membership is their public proclamation of what they believe.

If you have further questions concerning Siloah's practice toward The Lord's Supper, or would like to learn more about becoming a member of Siloah, please speak with one of the Elders.







Blessings as we begin publicizing the LWMS Milwaukee Metro-North Circuit Spring Rally.

The Spring Rally will be held at Salem Lutheran Church on April 29, 2023, 8am to Noon. Address: 6840 North 107th Street, Milwaukee WI 53224

Reporter's Meeting begins at 730am. Spring always means there will be a Furlough House collection.

Featured Speaker: Angelia Sievert who serves as our CAMM Chairwoman. She will speak on what is CAMM and the 63 years of service to Zambia & Malawi.

Mission Projects: The home mission project is the Summer Student Assistants (HM-2022-14). This is a ten week program where Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary students receive valuable experience while home mission congregations receive needed assistance. It is almost like a mini vicar experience. This program is solely funded by special gifts. The world mission project is the Europe Special Projects (WM-2022-18). WELS World Missions conducts gospel outreach throughout Europe, partnering to share Christ's grace in Russia, Albania, Bulgaria, and Ukraine while supporting sister church bodies in seven additional European countries. The focus of European mission work is changing to equip & train national pastors, many who are tent ministers to lead their own congregations and facilitating continuing education. Funds are needed to help cover transportation costs of guest lecturers and students, and help tent ministers attend continuing education classes.

New projects will be presented and voted on at the Rally.

Mission Offerings are due Wednesday, April 19th to the circuit. We have envelopes today with final collection Sunday April 16th.

Remember that our **Befriend a Mission** missionaries information can be found on our LWMS table by the elevator right outside the side entrance.

Election of circuit officers will be held for President, Treasurer, & Spiritual Growth Pastor. This ends Erica's second term as Treasurer for the circuit.

We invite our immediate neighbors to our Resurrection Sunday church service on Saturday, April 8, 2023, from 1:00 P.M. to 2:00 P.M. We'll canvass the closest blocks to our church with the following objectives:

- 1. We'll ask if residents received the postcard from Siloah Lutheran Church regarding our Resurrection Sunday Church Service.
- 2. We'll invite them to our Resurrection Sunday church service and mention the school enrollment portion of the postcard.
- 3. We will give them a postcard if they still need to receive a postcard and a church information packet.
- 4. We'll ask if they want to be on our mailing and email lists.
- 5. We'll write down the home address we visited and whether the residents received a postcard.

About the Postcards


Five hundred Resurrection Sunday postcards will be delivered by the United States Postal Service to homes within a mile of Siloah Lutheran Church between March 25, 2023, and April 1, 2023.

I also ordered 250 more postcards. Those postcards will arrive by March 27, 2023. I'll leave them at the front and rear entrances of the church on Sunday, April 2, 2023.

About the Blocks to be Covered

If ten people show up for canvassing, covering one block will take one hour because we'll knock on doors and have conversations.

We're targeting Blocks 26 and 27 or (50 homes) because they have school-aged children. Janet Broadnax and Annie Green have canvassed block 26 for a few years.



If anyone who lives or works in the church neighborhood has a better suggestion about which blocks to choose first, please email me.

I will distribute a copy of this email at the March 15th, Lenten Church service and follow up with a sign-up sheet at the adult Bible class on Sunday, March 19, 2023.

About the Church Information Packet

The Church Information Packet will contain the following items:

- 1. 2023 Resurrection Sunday Invitation postcard.
- 2. "Where are you going?" postcard.
- 3. The "You Matter to God" QR code card.

About Future Canvassing in 2023

We'll see who shows up on April 8, 2023, and ask who is available for June 2023. If we canvass in June, I must compile a mailing list for the blocks we intend to cover so that residents receive a postcard a week before we canvas.

In this case, we'll ask about the new postcard, which will probably be an invitation to our Sunday coffee fellowship, Christian education, and June school enrollment. If someone would like compile an address list of occupied homes for the block west of our church, email me.

About Volunteers

Some of us will only be able to manage stairs with risk, me included. Ask your adult children if they would be willing to help instead. Most of our volunteers, over 63 years old, cannot assist us as they have in the past. As always, you will canvass with a partner.

Volunteers should be ready to wear a face mask for protection from COVID-19. It might take a few months to cover two blocks with the few church partners who are able to volunteer.
