

Managing diabetes at the Zambia Lutheran rural health center

Diabetes has become a disease affecting many people in Zambia. In our area, we started with three patients in 2004. The number kept on increasing so much that we now have seen over one hundred diabetic patients in 2024. The increase is as a result of a change in lifestyle. The change of lifestyle has brought diseases like diabetes and hypertension. Many patients used to go to herbalists where they were not getting any help and patients used to wait a long time before coming to our clinic primarily due to a lack of knowledge.

Unfortunately, the government does not yet support rural care of chronic diseases like diabetes and hypertension. All the support of these chronic diseases was and is still focused on bigger, urban hospitals. In an effort to find out why there is no support for these diseases in rural areas, I went to the Ministry of Health. I was told that because these diseases are still so new in rural Zambia, the support had already been put in the urban areas where they have more diagnosed patients. As a result some of our diabetic patients have to travel 85 km to Lusaka for services at the University Teaching Hospital (UTH). These patients are fortunate enough to have the money to travel for the services. Patients who come to us with signs and symptoms of diabetes still need to be referred to bigger hospitals such as UTH which is



still a big problem in rural Zambia. This is because of money for transport. Patients with money are the only ones able to go. In an effort to help, the clinic staff decided to buy a glucometer with glucose test strips and have started testing for diabetes. In the first month, we tested twenty-five patients, of whom five had high readings of glucose. To start treatment, we referred them to UTH. Out of the five, only one managed to go for treatment. Four failed to go because they didn't have money. As a result, the clinic staff called for a meeting with village headmen to discuss the problem. This was done because one diabetic patient out of the four who failed to go to UTH unfortunately passed away from his condition. The calling of Headmen was done in line with the policy of the Central Board of Health. Any change of

a health program was to go through and be agreed by the community. All the headmen voted in favor of starting the diabetes program and I was able to get training and start a program in Zambia.


The program has grown so much that we now have patients from different areas (inside and outside of our area). Because of the help we get from CAMM and the quality services we provide for diabetes, the program is going very well. Managing diabetes properly has made the name of our clinic to go beyond our boundaries so much that we have diabetic patients coming from as far as Lusaka. Our community, patients and their relatives are happy with our diabetes programs. We are very grateful for the help in managing our diabetic patients. In the district, we are the only clinic involved in diabetes treatments. Some patients think our clinic is a mini hospital.

We have a diabetic clinic day once per month where we provide health education on diabetes. We are also privileged to have a nutritionist who was sent to our clinic this year in January of 2024. She focuses more on diabetic diet and the importance of maintaining the diet low in carbohydrates.

May God, the Almighty bless you in helping the poor in Zambia.

REPORTERS MEETING: 7:30 A.M.

REGISTRATION AND BREAKFAST: 8:00 A.M.

MORNING DEVOTION: Pastor Winkelman from Pilgrim opened the rally with prayer. John 14:6 "I am the truth, the way and the life". Jesus sent out apostles, which included Philip and St James the Lessor showing us how we are to also proclaim the word to all people. There is a feast day of Saint James the Lessor and Saint Phillip but little is known about them in the bible.

SPIRITUAL GROWTH: Information was presented by Spiritual Growth woman, Marlene Fay. Updates were given about our current Mission Missionaries: Pastor Cox (home mission) and Pastor Behmer (World Mission).

BUSINESS MEETING: The meeting was called to order by President Marie Aho.

SECRETARY REPORT: Minutes were provided in the folders. Attendees were asked to read these and review. Roll call was taken by the secretary. Of the 26 congregations in our circuit, 22 congregations were represented. There were visitors from the Paperland (Appleton) and Dodge/Washington County Circuits.—There were 7 first time attendees. Total attendance at the rally was 102.

TREASURERS REPORT: The treasurer's report was presented by Samantha Brockdorf with printout in the folder. Total working fund balance as of April 22, 2024 was \$642.52 Mission fund receipts of \$7776.98 with disbursement of 25% to International LWMS-\$1944.24; 37.5% to WELS Home Missions Tools for Outreach \$2916.37 and 37.5% or \$2916.37 to WELS World Missions.

The rally free will offering total ended with \$1359. (additional \$20 collected that day from what was reported at rally as \$1339)

Both the secretary and treasurer report were accepted by vote.

SEND ONE SISTER: Nancy Grittner from Christ Alone/Thiensville was notified of her selection to receive the registration fee of \$225.00 to attend the Convention in Sioux Falls in June 2024.

MISSION OFFERING PROJECTS: Projects were voted upon by ballot. The home mission project will be: Pastoral Studies Institute Project JMC -2024-03. The World Mission selected was Project WM-2024-20: Native American Missions.

CAMM: Vick Walther gave us an update on the Central Africa Medical Mission: The new ambulance (Toyota Land Cruiser) arrived in Lilongwe, Malawi. The purchase was made possible by donations. They are replaced every 5 years as they need reliable transportation.

GUEST SPEAKER: Mr. Shannon Bohme—WELS Mission Journeys:

Mission Journeys provides opportunities for WELS members to serve another congregation, often a home mission. Mission Journeys is like the old Kingdom Workers program, Faith in Action. The ministry philosophy is different in a few ways. The trips are self-funded by the volunteer teams, usually with assistance from the sending congregation and organizations like Thrivent. The teams are formed by one congregation, a LWMS circuit, or family. This allows for in-person training and encouragement. The final difference is the focus on engaging the team in local ministry after the mission trip. Some of the long term opportunities are at Holy Word in London, England of 3-6 months; Seattle, Washington 1-2 months. There are also short term service trips to London for 7 days; Latin America 5-7 days, Puerto Rico 5-7 days, Seattle, Washington 7 days; a home mission church 3-7 days; Apache Reservation 3-7 days. Typical cost of a trip is \$2000 plus air fare.

SILOAH'S BELIEFS ON THE SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR

The Sacrament of the Altar is:

- a gift which Christ our Lord has given to His Church.
- a tangible form of The Gospel that assures us of sins forgiven.
- a sacred act that expresses the full extent of Christ's love for His Church.
- an expression of unity and oneness in faith.

The Sacrament of the Altar is not:

- a sacred act that shows one Christian's superiority over another Christian.
- to be consumed by anyone outside of the Christian Church.
- intended for unbelievers.
- open to those who are not in fellowship with Siloah or the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod.

Scripture plainly says:

- The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ?
 For we, though many, are one bread and one body; for we all participate of that one bread. - 1Corinthians 10:16,17
- Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of The Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of The Lord.- 1Corinthians 11:27

Out of love and respect for our Lord Jesus, instruction is given before we receive the Sacrament. All Siloah Partners have been instructed in The Lord's Supper and hold to the beliefs printed above. If you are not a Siloah Partner, neither a member of a Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod church nor a member of a congregation in fellowship with WELS, we gently ask that you refrain from receiving the Sacrament of the Altar.

Remember, the reception of The Lord's Supper does not make a person a true believer, nor does the inability to receive the Sacrament make a person an unbeliever. There will be people in Heaven from all different Christian church-denominations; for Jesus tells us in Mark 16:16, "Whoever believes and is baptized shall be saved."
