



SILOAH'S BELIEFS ON THE SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR

The Sacrament of the Altar is:

- a gift which Christ our Lord has given to His Church.
- a tangible form of The Gospel that assures us of sins forgiven.
- a sacred act that expresses the full extent of Christ's love for His Church.
- an expression of unity and oneness in faith.

The Sacrament of the Altar is not:

- a sacred act that shows one Christian's superiority over another Christian.
- to be consumed by anyone outside of the Christian Church.
- intended for unbelievers.
- open to those who are not in fellowship with Siloah or the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod.

Scripture plainly says:

- The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? For we, though many, are one bread and one body; for we all participate of that one bread. 1Corinthians 10:16,17
- Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of The Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of The Lord.- 1Corinthians 11:27

Out of love and respect for our Lord Jesus, instruction is given before we receive the Sacrament. All Siloah Partners have been instructed in The Lord's Supper and hold to the beliefs printed above. If you are not a Siloah Partner, neither a member of a Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod church nor a member of a congregation in fellowship with WELS, we gently ask that you refrain from receiving the Sacrament of the Altar.

Remember, the reception of The Lord's Supper does not make a person a true believer, nor does the inability to receive the Sacrament make a person an unbeliever. There will be people in Heaven from all different Christian church-denominations; for Jesus tells us in Mark 16:16, "Whoever believes and is baptized shall be saved."

Juneteenth Day Street Festival Vendor Rules and Regulation

- ✓ Vendor Booth or Truck Booth Application Completed
- ✓ Vendor Fee Paid in Full (100% Payment)
- ✓ All food vendors are required to meet with The City of Milwaukee Health Department Officials.

We must receive all paperwork and payment in order to assign spaces and have cards for site assignments.

All site assignments will be given out on a paid in full, first-come, first serve basis.


Your Juneteenth Application & Payment Reserves Your Space.

Vendor Checklist:

- Vendors are responsible for setting up between the hours of 6:00am to 8:00am, for an 9am start and start breaking down their stations at 3:30pm, this year the festival ends at 4pm.
- Vendors must bring their own tents, covering, tables, display stands, tablecloths, chairs, change, generators and other items needed to successfully operate for the date.
- All vendors must completely clean up their area which includes charcoal and grease from the festival site.
- If you need additional information, please contact us at (414) 372-3770.
- All vendors are responsible for keeping their area clean.
- No vehicles will be allowed on Festival grounds before 6:00am or after 8:00a.m. for set up and after 4:00pm for removal from premises.
- All vehicles will be towed, if found on the grounds in nearby alleys at the owner's expense.
- All vendors will stop selling and passing out information at 3:30 p.m.
- This is imperative because there is a time limit on the permit and the festival grounds must be cleared of festival attendees.
- The Milwaukee Health Department and/or Police have the right to close down.
- The Milwaukee Police Department reserve the right to escort vendors from the festival that are not in compliance with Juneteenth Festival Rules and Regulations.
- Please make sure your list of items you are selling were correctly reflected on your application.
- All listed items must be reviewed and approved by the Juneteenth festival; to be permitted to be sold.
- Be very specific, items not listed will not be allowed.
- Juneteenth Day Street Festival will not allow anything to be sold with vulgar, offensive language or gestures. This includes t-shirts, pictures, mugs, posters, audiotapes, etc.
- Payment of vendor fees only entitles one to dispense materials of the individual category designated.

- Food items require specific permits from the City of Milwaukee Health and Licenses Department. Their phone number is: (414) 286-2238.
- Vendors agree not to reassign, sublet or share any part of its assigned space with any individual, organization or group.
- Any vendor who sublets or sells space will be removed from the Juneteenth festival grounds and all fees will be forfeited.
- All vendors will be assigned a specific location.
- All site assignments will be given out at the vendor meeting.
- Applications are subject to approval by President and his staff for the 54th Anniversary Juneteenth Festival.
- Juneteenth Day Street Festival reserves the right to reject applications from concessionaires who have not followed Festival Rules and Regulation in prior years.
- Vendor accepts full responsibility for all liability, injury, claim, loss, expense (including actual attorney fees) and damage to persons or property arising out of Vendor's; its employees; agents or volunteers' use, occupancy, or operations at the Juneteenth Day Street Festival by Northcott Neighborhood House Inc. and agrees to name Northcott Neighborhood House, Inc., 2460 North 6th Street and additional insured harmless.
- All vendors must pre-register and have the vendor application and paid in full. This fee is non-refundable, no exceptions. All other financial responsibilities and benefits belong solely to the vendor.
- It is the responsibility of the vendor to contact the Juneteenth Day Street Festival regarding space assignment and festival matters.
- All booth accountability and participation are strictly the vendor's responsibility, including all necessary materials, coverings, equipment, tables, chairs and licenses for same.
- Electricity and WIFI is not supplied for booth, truck or corporate space).
- All vendors must bring trash bags and trash containers to set up near their booth, again vendor's areas must be kept clean throughout the day.
