Siloah's Beliefs on The Sacrament of the Altar (Communion)

The Sacrament of the Altar is:

- A gift which Christ our Lord has given to His Church
- A tangible form of The Gospel that assures us of sins forgiven
- A sacred act that expresses the full extent of Christ's love for His Church
- An expression of unity and oneness in faith with those that take it together

The Sacrament of the Altar is not:

- A sacred act that shows one Christian's superiority over another Christian
- To be consumed by anyone outside of the Christian Church
- Intended for unbelievers
- To be taken at Siloah until a person confesses unity with Siloah and the Wisconsin Evangelical Lutheran Synod (WELS)

Scripture says:

Is not the cup of thanksgiving for which we give thanks a participation in the blood of Christ? And is not the bread that we break a participation in the body of Christ? Because there is one loaf, we, who are many, are one body, for we all share the one loaf. – 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

So then, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. – 1 Corinthians 11:27

Siloah's Communion Practice:

Out of love and respect for our Lord Jesus, instruction is given to anyone before they receive the Sacrament at Siloah. All Siloah communing Partners have been instructed and confess faith in unity with Siloah and the WELS. Siloah would be thrilled to have you join us for communion in the future! Our pastor would love to meet with you and prepare you to be blessed by communing at Siloah.

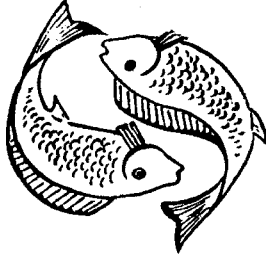

Adjacency or Authority:

A Visual Artist's Perspective

What is it like to be a serious visual artist who lives according to the Christian creeds?

During a time in which artists and their audiences are challenged to find anything about contemporary visual art that seems transcendent, the “beautiful idea” might seem lost or missing. This presentation examines our common assumptions—from secular and Christian perspectives—about visual artists, and it proposes that adjacency is a more appropriate position than authority.
